- Guest Speaker: Dr. Franklin Tuitt, Vice President and Chief Diversity Officer, UConn
 - o Dr. Tuitt was welcomed to UConn in late July of 2020
 - Came to UConn after 15 years at the University of Denver first starting as a Higher Education professor, then becoming the Associate Provost for Inclusive Excellence, and finally, was their Chief Diversity Officer from 2015-19
 - Goals for UConn- to facilitate for students a powerful sense of belonging to the University
 - How?
 - By meeting and bringing together as many people, organizations, and groups at UConn and learning what has worked in the past and what can be improved upon for the future
 - Creating a University wide website to streamline diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts
 - Ensuring equal access to all programs and resources
 - Noted that while the University has been successful in diversifying the student body, there is still a need to focus on another area- faculty and staff
 - A question that Dr. Tuitt poses to the community- How can we become leaders in our own respective areas to advance diversity, equity, and inclusion?

UConn COVID-19 Updates

- o Spring 2021 COVID Codes
 - Student affairs has developed a color coded system to reflect the current status of the campus relating to positivity rates and COVID-19 spread
 - Storrs Campus is currently in the yellow, which is considered moderate risk level
- o UConn COVID-19 Dashboard
 - To stay up to date on the reopening of UConn

Inform Website

 <u>InForm</u>, launched in Fall of 2019, is a tool to help the UConn community navigate the reporting process and support available for a variety of incidents including bias, harassment, safety concerns, and other types of misconduct

- Available to anyone coming into contact with UConn, including students, faculty, staff, visitors, and community members who have a concern to report, including bystanders
- Existing reporting forms and websites are not changing or going away. InForm simply
 acts as a hub for accessing all those forms from one place, with a greater level of
 guidance

- Also available on the DOS site is a compilation of <u>University communications</u> sent to the campus in response to bias reports
